

MACADAMIA (MACADAMIA TERNIFOLIA INTEGRIFOLIA) OIL

The Macadamia tree originates from Australia, usually around 11 m high, it can reach up to 20m. The oil is cold pressed from the kernel of the oil. The nut itself is very hard and difficult to crack.

In Thailand Macadamia trees are a relatively recent culture and are mostly grown in the North and some regions in the North East like Loei province.

The oil is mostly monounsaturated fatty acids (over 80%) and is very resistant to oxidation and rancidity.

The oil make a pleasant massage oil with a fine structure which penetrates the skin quite easily. It is a good carrier oil with affinity for mature and dry skins but might be a little bit heavy for younger skins.

Macadamia nuts also provide an excellent moisturizer. Lotions have been developed using the oil to help prevent dry skin. It is also reported to soften the skin and minimize the appearance of wrinkles. It is slowly becoming sought after in beauty products.

Lotions are not the only beauty product macadamia nuts have been used in. The oil has already been introduced in many hair products. It has also been used in manufacturing bar soaps as well as liquid gels and facial scrubs.
